

THE CANAAN COMMUNITY FOREST

The 424 acres of land comprising the Canaan Community Forest property was transferred to Town ownership on September 12, 2013. This land was acquired with 368 acres conserved under an easement held by the Vermont Land Trust, and 56 developable acres with available for future economic development. An additional 10 acre parcel and small building that was historically the Tillotson family camp was also purchased with funds from the Tillotson Trust.

The Canaan Community Forest Committee is presently made up of the following members: Odette Crawford, Yvan Doyon, Eugene Reid, Chris Masson, Morgan Wade, Vernon Crawford, Greg Noyes, and Noreen Labrecque (as Town treasurer). Presently, the committee is working on establishing recreational trails, either leasing the sugar woods or selling sap, and finalizing the management plan.

Recently, the Canaan Community Forest received a \$73,000 Tillotson grant to help the town move forward in meeting the goals of using the community forest property to enhance local educational, recreational, and economic opportunities. \$30,000 of this grant is proposed to be used to partially fund a position to develop and pilot a diversified agriculture program. This vocational program would educate juniors and seniors in our area on historical and current land uses in our region. Many of our students have strong connections to the local environment. The diversified agriculture program would prepare students for careers or further education in a variety of fields including agriculture, forestry, and the biological sciences. A truly integrated program would mesh literacy, math, and science, while students acquire deep knowledge about their natural surroundings. An example experience would involve students learning about a tree, harvesting it, and then designing, producing, and marketing a product all through Canaan Schools. The attached sheet will give you more ideas on what the diversified agriculture program could look like.

The remaining \$43,000 will be utilized in initiating our recreational and economic goals. Specifically, this coming summer we will start improving access to the property through the development of a series of trails for walking, hiking, cross country skiing, and snowshoeing. Approximately \$10,000 of the grant funds will go towards the trail work, with the remainder being used to start preparatory site work for the sugaring operation. An initial forest cutting, scheduled for winter of 2014, will need to occur prior to the establishment of any form of sugaring operation. County Forester, Matt Langlais, will coordinate and oversee this forest harvest.

It is hoped that wise use of these grant funds and our continued forward motion in meeting the community goals for this property will result in further funding. Any resident with any interest or thoughts on this work should feel free to contact a committee member at anytime.
