## Canaan Community Forest Helpful Trail Descriptions:

## From Rte. 253, Connecticut River Access

From the Rte. 256 access next to the Connecticut River, the trail will intersect a power line corridor about .20 miles from the river access kiosk. The CCF trail extends from this intersection *North* along the power line corridor about .20 miles to the Kenney Camp driveway. At the intersection of the power line corridor and the Kenney Camp driveway you can continue *NNE* up the driveway about 250 ft. to the Kenney Camp and continue around the loop passing the Kenney Camp access kiosk about 50 ft. West of the camp, OR you can take the snowmobile trail East which extends about .50 miles to where the CCF trail then rejoins the forest on your left (*North*) with a series of bog bridges *Note: the snowmobile trail is for spring, summer and fall access... a winter access for this section of the CCF Kenney Loop trail paralleling the snowmobile trail will be constructed when there is ample snow to make a snowshoe trail.* 

## From the Beecher Falls Access

From the Beecher Falls access, hike <u>East</u> about .10 miles to the intersection of the main CCF trail. At this junction you can hike the trail in either direction, which will loop back to this junction.

If you hike <u>SSW</u> at this junction, you will come to the snowmobile trail, about .20 miles. This part of the CCF trail extends <u>West</u> from this junction about .50 miles to the Kenney Camp driveway where you can continue the Kenney Loop trail by going 250 ft. <u>NNE</u> to the Kenney Camp Access which is about 50 ft. <u>West</u> of the Kenney Camp passing the Kenney Camp kiosk OR, you can hike about 100 ft. <u>SSE</u> to the power line corridor which will join the wooded section of the CCF trail about .20 miles and then will lead you to the Rte. 256, Connecticut River access. . Note: the snowmobile trail is for spring, summer and fall access... a winter access for this section of the CCF Kenney Loop trail paralleling the snowmobile trail will be constructed when there is ample snow to make a snowshoe trail.

If you hike *North* from this junction, you will come to a series of bog bridges followed by a gradual uphill climb to a series of switchbacks. After traversing the switchbacks you will be at the far *Northeast* corner of the Kenney Loop trail. At the top of the switchbacks you will cross a small foot bridge over a streambed. About .30miles from here the CCF trail joins the US/Canada border. It is okay to hike on the border trail... the CCF Kenny Loop trail extends about .10 miles to the *West* at this junction. Look for signs on your left (*South* of the Canada border) to guide you back into the Canaan Community Forest/Kenney Loop trail. About .50 miles from this US/Canada junction, you will come to the Kenney Cabin. Pass the Kenny Cabin Kiosk and take the driveway *SSE* about 250 ft. to the junction of the driveway and snowmobile trail (or winter access snowshoe trail) and hike *East* about .50 miles to the junction where the snowmobile trail (or winter access trail) will rejoin the CCF Kenney Loop trail in a *NE* direction. A series of bog bridges will be at this junction and will bring you back to the Beecher Falls spur/access trail.

## From the Kenney Camp Access

You can hike the loop in either direction.

If you start counter clockwise: join the intersection of the Kenney Camp driveway and snowmobile trail about 250 ft. **SW** of the Kenney Cabin. The CCF trail extends about .50 miles **East** at this junction and will re-enter the CCF Kenney loop trail to the **North** as you make a left turn at a series of bog bridges. Follow the trail around, passing the Beecher Falls access trail as well as a gradual climb up a set of switchbacks and then crossing a footbridge. .30 miles from this bridge you will join the US/Canada Border. It is okay to hike on the border. Hike **West** about .50 miles and look for signs on your left (**South**) to re-join the CCF trail. Follow back around to the Kenney Camp.

If you start clockwise: hike <u>North</u> and then <u>NNE</u> to the US/Canada border. It is okay to hike on the border. The trail extends about .50 miles <u>East</u> from this junction, look for signs to on your right (<u>South</u>) to re-enter the CCF Kenney Loop trail. Follow the trail about .30 miles to a footbridge and then a set of switchbacks as you descend to a low wet area with a series of bog bridges. Hike past the Beecher Falls access/spur trail to the junction of the snowmobile trail and CCF Kenney Loop trail. At this junction the trail extends about .50 miles <u>West</u> back to the Kenney Cabin drive way. Follow the driveway <u>North</u> about 250 ft. back to the Kenney Camp. Note: the snowmobile trail is for spring, summer and fall access... a winter access for this section of the CCF Kenney Loop trail paralleling the snowmobile trail will be constructed when there is ample snow to make a snowshoe trail.
