PROPERTY TAX BILLS

The Town of Canaan property tax bills have been mailed and are due on or before October 1st, 2022. Besides the regular office hours of 8:00 A.M. to 4:00 P.M. Monday through Thursday and 8:00 A.M. to 3:00 P.M. on Friday, the Canaan Town Clerk's office will be open on Saturday, October 1st from 8:00 A.M. 4:00 P.M. for the purpose of collecting the 2022 Property Taxes. Any tax dollars received after that date are delinquent and subject to delinquent fees and interest charges. The night deposit at the Town Office is also available for your convenience. Postmarks do not count as on-time payment; "Cash must be in hand" to constitute an on-time payment.

SELECTBOARD QUARTERLY REPORT

TRANSFER STATION

Notice to all Contractors who either reside in Canaan or are completing a project in Canaan, please purchase or rent your own dumpster for the jobsite. Do not bring the worksite debris down to the Transfer Station and put it in the C&D container. This is for household C&D only. Please see pages five and six for other important updates regarding the Transfer Station.

CANAAN HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT

The work on the Hall Stream Bridge will not be completed this year. We only received a single bid for the job, and want to wait until next year to see if we get more interest. We are resubmitting the job out for bid in November with work to be done the following year. This will be a rehabilitation of the bridge, only fixing the supports in the water and the abutments. We would like to remind everyone that the bridge does have a load limit that should be followed by all. Violations of this load limit has been ongoing and need to cease. If these ongoing violations of exceeded load limits across the bridge continue we may be forced to set up cameras to see who is violating the load limit. Any violator caught on camera will be fined accordingly.

We have done a Better Back Roads project up on Canaan Hill which has recently been completed. We have fixed the ditches by the bridge and replaced guardrails. The work has been inspected by the State and has passed. Also this year, prior to this project, the Canaan Highway Department used grants to fund work on Powerhouse Road, where a section of badly rotting culvert was replaced.

One last reminder from the Highway Department. Park Street by the Library is now a one-way street. Please see page 14 for more details on this change. Our hope is that this change will make the street safer for residents and will make it easier to plow in the Winter.

A safety reminder

Check and replace the batteries in your smoke and carbon monoxide (CO) alarms.

Ensure they are working correctly, and replace the batteries. As the cold sets in and many start up their gas-fired furnaces, fireplaces, portable heaters, etc., for the first time, carbon monoxide poisoning risks increase dramatically. Replace any smoke alarm unit that is older than ten-years. Replace any CO alarm unit that is older than five-years. Following this schedule can mean the difference between life and death.

Stay Safe, Canaan!

SOLID MATERIALS

Your private or municipal system can process only toilet paper, which is designed to fall apart rapidly.

Never flush household solid waste such as paper, cloth, or plastic film, even if the package says it's "flushable." Those "flushable" wipes are a leading cause of serious clogs - never flush them!

These items don't dissolve. They mix with fats, oils, and greases, creating clogs that require costly repairs. They can also cause sewage overflows into rivers and lakes.

SOLID MATERIALS DISPOSAL

Toss household solid waste materials into the trash for pickup, or take them to your municipal drop-off. Don't try to burn or compost them (except food scraps)!


Food scraps also cause clogs -- and in-sink disposals don't help! Compost them if you can. Vermont law requires that by July, 2020, all food scraps be diverted from landfills to uses like composting and bio-digestion. Your trash hauler will facilitate.

NEVER FLUSH

The following common household items should never be flushed:

- Paper towels
- Disposable diapers
- Tampons & applicators
- Sanitary napkins
- Hair
- Rags
- Dryer lint
- · Cleaning/disinfectant wipes
- Cigarette butts
- · Q-Tips
- · Dental floss
- Bandages
- Condoms
- Cotton balls
- Facial tissues
- Flushable wipes
- Candy wrappers

CANDY



FATS, OILS, & GREASES

Never pour fats, oils, or greases (a.k.a. FOGs) into sink, toilet, or storm drain!

When they solidify, FOGs impair performance and require pumping or replacement of small septic systems. FOG clogs in public sewer pipes and pumps cause breakdowns that result in sewer overflows and costly repairs. Either way, you pay.

FOGs combine with solid materials - see opposite side - and create "fatbergs." These horror-story clogs cost New York City taxpayers \$20 million a year. Some towns in Vermont pay up to \$40,000 in avoidable clog repairs.

In-sink disposals do not dissolve FOGs!

Don't put FOGs into compost. They can attract pests and slow the composting process.

For more information on damage caused by clogs, do a web search for "fatbergs" lots of wonderfully gross videos!

FOG SOLUTIONS

Bacon Grease & Deep-Fry Oil:

- Save in a jar and re-use. Do a web search for "what to do with bacon grease" for great food recipes and advice on how to make soap, candles, lip balm, bird food, and more.
- Let cool until solidified, then wrap and dispose of in your trash.
- When warm, pour into a sealable jar or directly into your trash bag among absorbent materials.
- Wipe warm pans with a paper towel before washing; toss towels in trash.

Regular Frying & Salad Oil:

- Wipe all frying pans when butter, fat, or oil is still warm, then wash.
- Wipe salad bowls before washing.
 Use paper towels and dispose of them in the trash.





Town of Canaan Trash Bags Price Increase to \$21 per Sleeve Effective October 1, 2022

As we all know, the cost of everything keeps rising, and the Town of Canaan is not immune to these increases. The Transfer Station has incurred significant changes and upgrades in the past two years. In 2020, the State mandated all Towns collect food scraps which added the additional expense of another employee and composter to take care of the food scraps. This past year the Town of Canaan has replaced two overhead doors that were falling into disrepair and were a safety concern to employees and users. Electricity has been added to the garage area to support the security system. Additionally, the containers have seen better days and will need to be replaced or undergo major repairs, both costly options.

Over the past four years, total expenditures for the Transfer Station have risen about 28%. Below is a chart detailing the rise in expenditures over these four years. These expenditures include the cost per bag, tipping, tonnage, trucking, etc. With these added expenditures, the Town has been forced to raise the price per bag from \$17.00 to \$21.00, an increase of 23%. To offset these costs completely, we would have to raise the price of bags to \$32.00. We understand the burden this could pose to residents and have only increased the prices minimally to help offset the amount being paid by taxpayers. This increase may seem drastic, but when broken down, it is an increase of \$0.44 per year since the last increase in 2013 from \$15.00 to \$17.00.

The Selectboard is also in the process of doing a complete overhaul of the fee schedule for C&D disposal at the Transfer Station and will be increasing prices for those items. In the meantime, effective October 1, 2022, the only price increases will be for the bags going from \$17.00 to \$21.00. Tires up to 20" will increase from \$3 to \$5 per tire. Tires 20" to 24" will increase from \$6 to \$10 per tire.

How to Dispose of Refrigerators, Freezers, and Air Conditioners?

The Town of Canaan has partnered with the Towns of Stewartstown, NH; Columbia, NH; and Lemington, VT to dispose of household appliances that contain freon. Residents of Canaan and Beecher Falls will be able to bring these appliances (Refrigerators, Freezers, Air Conditioner, etc.) to the Coos County Transfer Station. All households will be allowed two appliances every year for the price of \$25 per appliance. All disposals after that will cost \$50. Follow these steps to dispose of these appliances:

- 1. Go to the Canaan Transfer Station 186 Treatment Plant Road
- 2. Once there the Canaan Transfer Station Attendant(s) will give you a form stating that you are from Canaan/Beecher Falls.
- 3. The Attendant(s) will mark the appliance with both a "C" and your phone number, indicating who it belongs to and that it is coming from Canaan.
- 4. You will need both the marking and the signed form to be able to drop off appliances at the Coos Transfer Station.
- 5. Now you are ready to bring the appliance to the Coos Transfer Station for disposal. The \$25 or \$50 will be given to the attendant there. Please respect all rules that the Coos Transfer Station may have regarding these appliances.


Public Notice:

Career and Technical

Education DirectorChris Damato

The 2022-23 school year is Chris's second year as the CTE Director. Chris grew up in Vermont and Texas, and has served as an educator in both those states. Before coming to Canaan he served as a Social Studies teacher, worked in adult education, and was the assistant CTE director at Green Mountain Technical Center.

Along with leading Canaan's CTE department, Chris oversees our students' work based learning experiences. Through work based learning our Juniors and Seniors take part in internships at local businesses.

Last year Chris secured a \$300,000 grant from the New Hampshire Charitable fund to improve the entrance way to the center, upgrade our offsite locations, and invest in workplace development.

Property owners are reminded that a zoning permit is required for ANY land development including "division of a parcel into two or more parcels, the construction, reconstruction, relocation or enlargement of any building or other structure, whether it is portable, on a slab, on cement blocks or a foundation, and any change in the <u>use</u> of any building or other structure, or land," it needs a permit.

Please feel free to contact the Zoning Administrator whenever you are in doubt as to the need for a zoning permit. To date this year, we have issued 25 permits. Canaan is thriving.

The Canaan Planning Commission and Zoning Board of Adjustments would like to thank all who help us with our work as we continue to serve the Town of Canaan. Public Notice:

At the July 25, 2022, Select Board meeting, the board received a letter requesting that Park Street be turned into a one-way. Following that meeting, the Select Board reviewed the statutes regarding reclassifying roads. A public notice was then posted in the News and Sentinel requesting feedback from residents. At the August 22, 2022 meeting, the Select board voted unanimously to change Park Street into a one-way.

This reclassification is in effect and must be followed. Residents can enter Park Street from Gale Street and exit onto VT RTE 102. No traffic shall enter from VT RTE 102. Parking was also changed; now, per town rules, vehicles can only park on the Fletcher Park side of the street. No Parking is allowed on the opposite side. Overflow parking for the Library can relocate to the Rec Park.

NOTICE TO VOTERS WHO WISH TO VOTE BY ABSENTEE BALLOT IN THE 2022 GENERAL ELECTION

Please fill out the certificate on the voted ballot envelope to ensure that your ballot is counted in the general election. For your vote to count, all items must be filled out, and they must be signed. If you plan to mail your ballot back to the Town Office, please do so at least two weeks in advance of the election. After this two-week period, the best delivery method is to drop them off at the Town Office in person or in the overnight deposit box. Any ballots received after November 8, 2022, at 7:00 P.M. will be considered late and void.

GENERAL ELECTION - TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 8, 2022

The Vermont Secretary of State's Office has decided to once again mail ballots to every registered voter in the State of Vermont. They plan on mailing these ballots around September 26, 2022, so hopefully, as you read this newsletter, you have received your ballot. If you do not receive your ballot by mid-October, we will encourage you to contact the Town Office or the Secretary of State's Office. Some common reasons for not receiving your ballot are: your registration has been challenged, or your correct address is not on your My Voters Page Profile.

This method of distribution allows you to vote in two different ways. The first is that once you receive your ballot, you can vote immediately and send it to the Town Office. Exactly like voting by absentee ballot. The second is that you can vote in person, using the ballot you have received. This would mean you come into the office on election day and vote in person. We ask that you remember to bring in the ballot sent to you. If you don't, you will be required to sign an affidavit in accordance with 13 V.S.A. §2901 and 17 V.S.A. §1971.

We encourage everyone in Canaan to get out and vote. It is a civic duty that we take for granted but a duty that many people worldwide wish for!


